s or less out of the maximum evaluation, which means that the work done by the student is not enough and he/she has to retake the course.
aluation in any component of the educational program, the University must hold an additional examination within not later than 5 days after the announcement of the results obligation shall not apply to the dissertation, Master's project/thesis or other scientific project/paper. The points, awarded to the student in the summative evaluation, shall no student at the additional examination is the summative evaluation and shall be included in the final evaluation program. In case of taking 0-50 points in the final evaluation, including the evaluation obtained at the additional examination, the student evaluation will be F-0 points.
the Grade Point Average (GPA) is part of the system of evaluation of the student's knowledge.
